Course Description	In this study tour, you will be introduced to the blend of modern and traditional fashion and culture that inform the thriving and contemporary fashion scene in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam.
	You will be introduced to a unique range of resources that will inform the process of creating your own version of the traditional Vietnamese costume the 'Ao Dai'. Following an initial research phase, you will then design your own Ao Dai, before visiting fabric markets and silk suppliers, and having your unique design crafted by a local tailor.
	The Study Tour will also include visits to local fashion brands and stores, manufacturers, museums (including the Ao Dai Museum), workshops and lectures at RMIT University.
